Brief description of the project:

The research project is conducted within the Innovative Training Network (ITN) "Caspian". It is funded by an MSCA grant of the European Union within the context of Horizon 2020 (Grant agreement no: 642709). The research analyzes the impact of recipient government-donor and donor-donor interaction on project implementation and its sustainability. Specific areas of interest are tuberculosis and HIV/AIDS. The research focuses on Kyrgyzstan and Armenia.

Tasks of the freelance assistant:

The main task is to assist an early-stage researcher to collect secondary research data on donor-state cooperation and development aid sustainability. Duration depends on **task completion**. Ideally, the successful candidate is expected to start asap and finish the task **by the end of April 2017**. If needed, the duration will be extended.
